Indian government officials and security and intelligence services are facing criticism for their failure to see the recent Mumbai terror attacks coming and failure to take action. The terrorists are said to have come from Pakistan but the Pakistani Govt say they were not involved. Rohan Gunaratna, International Centre for Political Violence and Terrorist Research, Nanyang Technological University, says the terrorists travelled from Pakistan by sea to Mumbai and had linked up to elements within India. Gunaratna says the training indicated a link to Al Qaeda and says it is important for India to realise they can prevent similar attacks in the future by making agreements with neighbours.
