

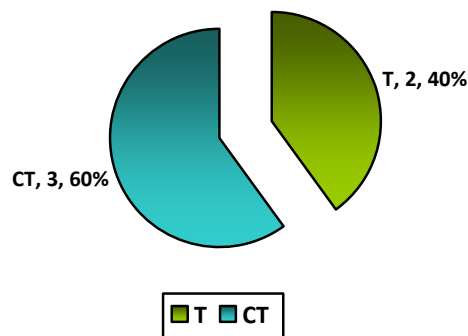
**MONTHLY COUNTRY REPORT  
INDONESIA  
DECEMBER 2007**

This month saw slight decrease in terrorist activity in Indonesia. There were 2 terrorist attacks in Indonesia for the month of December and 3 counter terrorism operations launched by the Indonesian authorities in the same month. The terrorist attack was small in nature, occurring in Central Sulawesi. This indicates that there is still a group operating in tense post-conflict situation in Central Sulawesi. The counter terrorism operations conducted were in response to the terrorist attack in Poso in 2005 as well as the final verdict from Supreme Court on the execution of three Bali bombers – Mukhlas, Imam Samudra and Amrozi. Indonesia government also has moved the court against the allegedly number one personnel in Jemaah Islamiyah, Abu Dujana.

**Number of Incidents**

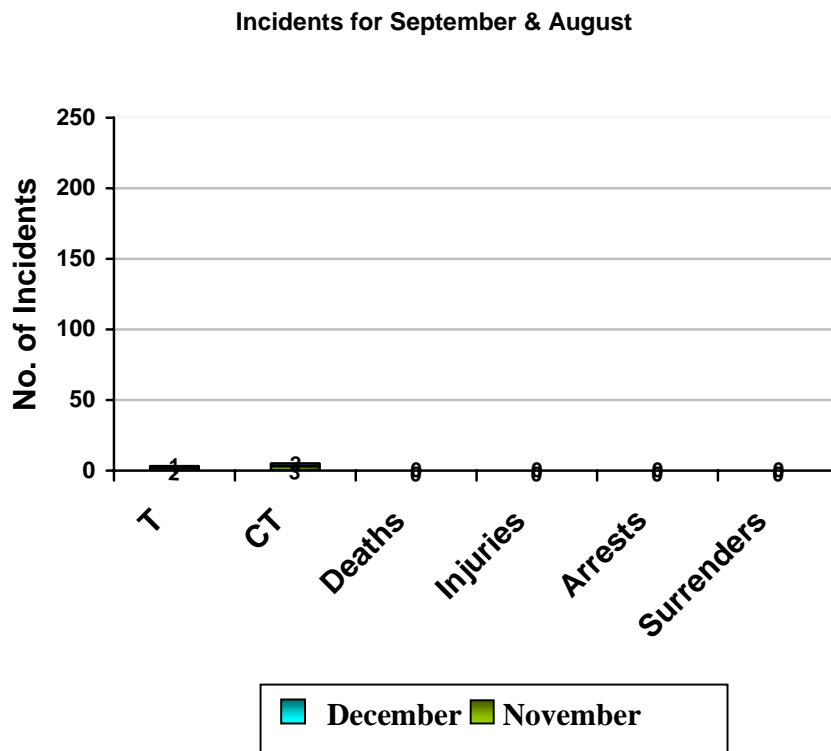


- Two bombs exploded in separate locations in Central Sulawesi on 5 December 2007. In Poso, one came from an empty plot some 200 meters from a military barrack, another one in the Dolo area, Southern Palu, the provincial capital. This incident took place about two hours after the first blast. No casualties have been reported. The case is still under investigation.
- In counter terrorism, there were 11 terrorists convicted for their roles in the Poso conflict received sentences ranging from 14 – 19 years. They were Basri aka Ayas

aka Bagong (19 years); Ardin Janatu aka Rojak (14 years); Ridwan (14 years); Tugiran (14 years); Syaiful Anam aka Mujadid aka Brekele (18 years); Rahman Kalahe aka Wiwin (19 years); Yudi Heriyanto Parsan aka Udit (10 years); Amril Ngiode aka Aat (15 years); Irwanto (14 years); Agus Nur Muhammad aka Agus Jenggot (14 years); Abdul Muis aka Muis bin Kamaluddin (18 years).

- Abu Dujana, the alleged leader of Jemaah Islamiyah trial began in Jakarta. Abu Dujana is accused of ‘plotting terrorist activities’ and sheltering senior militants. The prosecutor asked for death penalty.

### Comparative Analysis



- The number of terrorism incidents has increased from 1 in November to 2 in December.
- Between October and November, the number of casualties remains constant. The overall number of casualties has been low over these two months, primarily because there have not been any major attacks in Indonesia.
